PAWS: PET ADOPTION WITHOUT SURRENDER

Did you know that HAHS helps people find new homes for their pets? What happens when an owner needs help finding their pet a new home and they prefer not to surrender their pet to a shelter or humane society? That is where the PAWS program can help.

First, the animal must be up-to-date on veterinary care with supporting documentation from their vet. It must

be spayed or neutered as well. Second, The owner acts as a “foster caregiver” and takes the phone calls from those who are interested. And, finally the owner decides who they choose to take their pet. They can also decide if there is to be an adoption fee paid to them by the adopter.

PAWS helps by posting a photo of the animal on PETFINDER and in local

newspapers as “PET OF THE WEEK.”

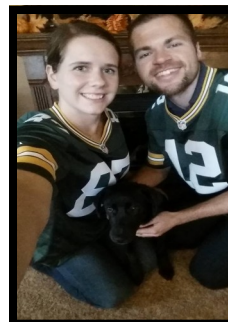
HELPING ANIMALS IN NEED — KELLY'S KRAZY FOSTER FARM

Kelly Adler began fostering for HAHS early in 2017. Kelly grew up just outside of Millville and went to Lake City public schools. She now lives a few miles from where she grew up.

Kelly is a registered nurse in the cardiac ICU unit at St. Mary's Hospital in Rochester.

Kelly and her husband David were married this past fall. They have two cats

and a dog, all adopted. Growing up, Kelly's pets were dogs, cats, a bearded dragon, chickens, ducks, and a hamster. Kelly states, “I give animals a place to call home while they are waiting for their new forever home. I socialize them to my cats, dog and all my nieces and nephews when they are over. Since HAHS doesn't have a physical shelter for animals to stay, I have opened up my home as a place for them.”
