Hiawatha Animal Humane Society (HAHS) is fortunate. It has great members and friends. In 2017, because of you, HAHS was able to rehome 63 cats and 21 dogs. Currently 11 animals are in foster care. These 95 animals all received veterinary care, vaccinations and spay/neuter procedures. In 2017 HAHS trapped five dozen feral cats. They were spayed/neutered and released, thus preventing more litters of unwanted cats.

Unfortunately, not all animals have smooth sailing before going into adoptive homes.

Take for instance Olive. In early December 2017 a cat carrier was discarded along a road. Locked inside was a young cat with no food or water or even a blanket to keep warm. She was just dumped.

Over the next couple of

days a person on their way to and from work noticed the cat carrier sitting on the side of the road, not knowing or seeing that there was a cat locked inside. Finally when they stopped to check it out, locked inside the carrier was a starving, cold and barely alive young cat.

Olive was turned over to HAHS and quickly taken to a veterinarian. Olive was cared for by veterinary staff until well enough to go to a foster home where her care continued. Once fully recovered she was spayed.

Olive was eventually adopted and is loving and playful and well loved in her new home. If she could speak she would certainly thank the good Samaritan that saved her life.

The care that Olive required as well as the many other animals taken in by HAHS comes at a big financial cost, not to mention time by HAHS.
