## MEET HAHS DOG FOSTER, MACKENZIE URBAN

MacKenzie and Gambit

MacKenzie Urban is one of HAHS's newest fosters. She grew up in the small Minnesota town of Truman. As a child she had cats and turtles, but always wanted a dog.

While a student at Winona State University, MacKenzie got to know Lake City and visited the area whenever she was able. Her visits to the Lake City area would eventually influence her choice of employment and where she would live.

After graduating WSU, MacKenzie volunteered at an animal shelter where she fell in love with a shelter dog named Gambit. MacKenzie visited Gambit for months, but could not adopt him as she lived in housing that was not pet friendly. In spring of 2019 she was offered, and accepted a position as a Mental Health Therapist with the Minnesota Correctional Facility in Red Wing. That was motivation for her to buy a house so Gambit could move with her. MacKenzie says, "I brought him home 2 days after I bought a home in Lake City. He was a dog that only had one visitor, me, the entire time he was at the shelter. He was such a skittish dog. Once I got him in a home environment his confidence in himself and his personality really came out!"

When asked why she decided to become a foster with HAHS she replied, "I want to help out dogs that are in the same situation as Gambit, where they might seem "unadoptable", but blossom in a home environment."

Gambit is a German shepherd/pit bull mix. He is almost two years old and enjoys taking road trips and hiking with MacKenzie. Gambit graduated obedience school and basic boot camp. He has a goofy personality and very playful. His favorite pastime is sitting on a bench and looking out the window of his home at the park across the street. MacKenzie remarks, "Gambit is the love of my life and I don't know how I ever lived without him."

MacKenzie also volunteers with the American Legion Auxiliary and is a member of Sigma Sigma Sigma alumni chapter.
